REFUND POLICY: Withdrawals during the first 60% of a term are given a pro-rata refund of tuition, room and board. Fees are not refundable. There is no refund after 60% of the term has passed. During the first week of a semester (first day of a May Term, or a Summer Session), 100% of tuition, room and board is refunded. After the first week of a semester or the third day of a May Term or a Summer Session there is no refund for partial reduction in enrollment.

THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT
Official Notification of Rights Under FERPA

Student education records are official and confidential documents protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Educational records, as defined by FERPA, include all records that schools or education agencies maintain about students. FERPA affords students certain rights with respect to their educational records. These rights include:

1. The right to inspect and review their records. Students should contact the Office of the Registrar to determine the location of appropriate records and the procedures for reviewing such records.
2. The right to request that records believed to be inaccurate or misleading be amended. The request should be submitted in writing to the office responsible for maintaining the record. If the request for change is denied, the student has a right to a hearing on the issue.
3. The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's educational records. Generally the College must have written permission from the student before releasing any information from the student's record. FERPA does, however, authorize disclosure without consent in certain situations. For example, disclosure without consent can be made to school officials with a legitimate education interest in the record.

A school official is a person employed by the institution in an administrative, supervisory, academic, research or support staff position; a person or company with whom the institution has contracted (i.e., an auditor, attorney or collection agency); contractors, volunteers, and other non-employees performing institutional services and functions; a person serving on the Board of Trustees; a student serving on an official committee or assisting another school official in performing his/her task. A legitimate education interest exists if the school official needs to view the education record to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, Morningside College will disclose education records, without consent, to officials of another school in which the student seeks or intends to enroll.

Morningside College may also disclose "directory" information without the student's prior consent. Directory information is defined as:

- Name
- Local and permanent addresses
- Telephone number(s)
- E-mail address
- Date and place of birth
- Major or field(s) of study
- Dates of attendance
- Grade level
- Enrollment status (FT/PT; undergraduate/graduate)
- Degrees, awards, and honors received and dates
- Expected date of completion of degree requirements and graduation
- Participation in officially recognized activities and sports
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- Most recent educational institution attended
- Photograph

Students have the right to prevent directory information from being released. In order to maintain directory information as confidential, a student must sign a non-release form in the Registrar's Office by the end of the second week of the fall semester. This release restriction is effective for the academic year and must be filed each year.

4. The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning an alleged failure by the institution to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

SPRING SEMESTER 2012

Each student should meet with his/her advisor according to the advising schedule below to determine a schedule for the 2012 Spring Semester.

On the assigned date for registration (see registration schedule below) you will go into CampusWeb and enter your own registration, as determined by you and your advisor. Once you submit your registration, it will go to your advisor for approval or rejection. When you receive notice (via campus e-mail) that your registration has been approved, you may check your schedule for the 2012 Spring Semester on CampusWeb. If you are not allowed to register for an individual course, you should submit all other courses and then go to the Registrar's Office to add the final course(s). You may change your own registration on line as long as it is done during the designated times for your class. After that time you will need to go to the Registrar's Office.

IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO TAKE LESS THAN 9 HOURS FOR THE 2012 SPRING SEMESTER, YOU MUST REGISTER AT THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE, NOT ON CAMPUSWEB.

On November 21 registration will be open to unadmitted students. New freshmen and transfer students may register on or after November 21. Post –Secondary and Senior Scholar students may register after December 12.

VALIDATION OF REGISTRATION, January 10

All students carrying 9 or more credits, including those registering on January 10, must complete all registration procedures. Any student not validating his or her registration by January 10 is required to pay a late registration fee.

REGISTERED STUDENTS

Order of the validation process:

1. Students will locate posted lists to determine whether they will go through the express line or the regular validation line.
2. Students will report to the Olsen Student Center.
3. Present student ID and proceed through the validation process.

There will be no schedule changes made on Validation Day. Drop/add cards will be available at the Registrar's Office beginning January 11. There will be no charge for the drop/add cards. Any student not validating his/her registration by January 10 is required to pay a late registration fee.

STUDENTS WHO HAVE NOT PRE-REGISTERED FOR CLASSES

New students who have not pre-registered for the spring term may do so on January 10, 2012.

Registration materials may be obtained in the Admissions Office, and there will be faculty available for assistance in scheduling. Upon completion of the registration form, materials **must** be returned to the Registrar's Office where pre-registration will be processed. Students enrolling for 9 or more hours will then proceed to the Olsen Student Center to the regular validation line. Registration will not become effective until the completion of this entire process.

Returning students who have not pre-registered will need to meet with their advisor as soon as possible, beginning January 10, to determine a schedule. Upon completion of the registration form, materials **must** be returned to the Registrar's Office where pre-registration will be processed.

NOTE: IN ORDER TO AVOID CLOSED CLASSES AND DELAYED PROCESSING, IT IS TO YOUR ADVANTAGE TO REGISTER DURING THE ADVANCE PRE-REGISTRATION PERIOD IN OCTOBER/NOVEMBER.

PASS/FAIL COURSES

The pass/fail option form must be filed in the Registrar's Office within the first week of the semester (by January 18, 2012). A student may elect no more than four hours of pass/fail per semester, nor exceed a total of 16 semester hours of pass/fail in a four-year degree program. No change from pass/fail option to letter grade may be made after Wednesday, January 18.

Only totally "free" electives may be used in this option. This excludes all courses in major or minor areas, a cluster, the core or general studies requirements, professional courses, and any course required by the college or licensing agencies.

AUDIT

To audit a course, a student must have the signature of the instructor. The student must register for the course as an audit within the first week of the semester, or within the first two days of a May Term or summer session. Completion of a form (available at the Registrar's Office) will document the audit.

The audit option is available to encourage students to explore unfamiliar fields or to experiment with new interests. Audit enrollment in courses provides students the opportunity to attend a class as a noncredit participant. Audit courses may not be used in a major, minor, or cluster, general education requirement, or any other graduation requirement. They may be used only as electives. Students may not register to audit internships, tutorials, studio art, applied music, music ensembles, or other courses that, by their nature, are inappropriate for auditing, as determined by the college.

Students who audit a course are expected to attend a minimum of two-thirds of the class meetings, but are not responsible for papers, tests, or other graded assignments, nor will the instructor be expected to evaluate such work. For more information on the audit, consult the College Catalog.

An audited course is considered a part of the regular class load and may not be carried as an academic overload (more than 18 hours) without permission. If the audit course causes an academic overload, hours above 18 hours will be charged at the hourly overload tuition rate.

INDEPENDENT STUDY

Students capable of doing significant independent work may choose to pursue independent study. Independent study provides students with an opportunity to undertake a program of supervised reading, research, or artistic production not provided within existing courses. Independent study is open only to students who have attained junior or senior standing and have a cumulative gpa of at least 2.50. A maximum of one independent study in any semester, three in total, is permitted. Completed independent study papers must be presented at the time of registration. Late independent study forms will require an add/drop card.

INTERNSHIP

The internship is a course which provides students with the opportunity to apply previous classroom theory to practical situations. Internships are assigned from 1 to 6 credits and must be in the student's major or minor. A student may take more than one internship, but no more than 6 credits of internship may apply toward the 124 credit hours required for graduation. It is open only to those students who have achieved Junior or Senior standing. An internship form must be presented at the time of registration.

FINANCIAL AID

Students enrolled for six hours or more per semester may be eligible for financial aid programs. Both full- and part-time students must be formally admitted to Morningside College before receiving financial aid. For information on financial aid programs and application procedures, contact Student Financial Planning on the second floor of Lewis Hall or at (712) 274-5159.

REPEATED COURSES

A student may repeat a course more than once. Credits for that course, however, may be counted only once when figuring total hours toward graduation. See your advisor for information and the Registrar's Office for the necessary form.

FINAL EXAM SCHEDULE

Final examinations for the 2012 Spring Semester will be Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, May 2 – 4, and Monday and Tuesday, May 7 and 8. Scheduled times for the examinations will be published at a later date.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR FINAL EXAMS

Final exams occur during the last few days of each semester. All classes should meet during the final exam period—even those in which no exam is given.

1. All final examinations must be given during the final exam period.
2. Instructors are not required to give final exams; however, the final exam class period must be used for class instruction or some other class activity.
3. Extra-curricular activities may not be scheduled during the final exam period. These activities include: athletic events, trips, dramatic productions, operation of the campus radio station, music recitals, faculty committee meetings, student organization activities, and other similar activities.
4. All classes scheduled at traditional times receive one exam class period during finals.

PREREQUISITES AND INFORMATION

Specific course prerequisites are listed; assumed prerequisites exist relative to a student's class standing (FR, SOPH, JR, SR) and are explained in the current catalog. The responsibility for meeting prerequisites rests with the student.

Course Descriptions

Section 001 • Close Encounters with Addiction • Shelley Molland • MWF • 9:15-10:20

Anyone who has in any way been touched by addiction or simply is “addicted” to *My Strange Addiction* on TLC will be drawn into this topic. The addictive powers of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, food, sex, gambling, shopping, and yes, even tanning, will be explored. Is addiction a human failing or are the substances of addiction a means of filling a void of inner emptiness? Gabor Mate’s controversial book *In the Realm of Hunting Ghosts* will be our starting point as we look at case studies, causes of addiction, and roads to recovery.

Section 002 • Visions of Ordinary Life • Patrick Blaine • MWF • 9:15-10:20

This section of C&C will consider different perspectives on common assumptions about what we eat, how we live, and ways we learn. We will start by viewing some films like *Super Size Me*, *King Corn*, and *Waiting for Superman* then branch out to explore issues that interest you like how we treat our environment, what foods we put in our bodies, and more.

Section 003 • Mysteries, Crimes, & Psychopaths • Karmen Ten Napel • MWF • 9:15 - 10:20

People abhor violent crimes, yet oddly enough, we are often captivated by such stories. In this course, we will not only read and write about unsolved crimes, social deviants, and disturbing events, but we will also contemplate issues such as whether or not crime is beneficial to society, if our current justice system working, if serious sex offenders should be castrated, if supermax prisons are effective ways to punish hardened criminals, and so on. Please join us if you like to read, write, and discuss these ideas!

Section 004 • More Than Fun and Games: How Online Gaming is Changing the World • Jennifer Stout • MWF • 9:15-10:20

Would it surprise you to know that the average gamer is 35 years old? That 40% of gamers are women? And that worldwide, people are spending over 3 billion hours a week gaming? This class will explore how playing video games affects us as individuals and as a society. Psychologists, educators, medical professionals, and economists each provide insight into the question: Are video games good for us?

Section 005 • Science and Nature Writing for Curious Bipedes • Ross Fuqlsang • MWF • 10:30-11:35

We live in a world that depends on science, technology, invention and innovation. At the same time it is a world that is increasingly skeptical of scientific “fact.” In this course curious bipeds will have the opportunity to explore and research – for themselves – issues related to science and nature in order to discover what could be true about the world, and how scientific discovery informs and influences

our lives. Possible topics for discussion include the environment, medicine, artificial intelligence, energy, and the meaning of life.

Section 006 • *Goths, Trekkies, Cheeseheads, Parrotheads, and Potterheads: Fandom as Subculture*

The ability to “like” almost anything on Facebook has made it easier than ever to identify and interact with people who share our likes. This class will explore why we are fans of sports teams, musicians, movies, television shows, actors, authors, products, businesses, etc.; why we feel a sense of sympathy and camaraderie with people whose interests are similar; and how these feelings lead to the formation of subcultures within our society.

Section 007 • *Playing, Saying, Evading: Gender in Sports, Media, and Politics* • Jeremy Schnieder • MWF • 10:30-11:35

Is gender something that we as people shape or something that shapes us? The answer may not be as simple as it seems. By analyzing the ways our society plays, talks, and makes political decisions, this section of C&C will discuss some of the ways that gender affects our values.

Section 008 • *Our American Love Affair with Popular Music* • Jennifer Peterson • MWF • 10:30-11:35

Who doesn't love popular music? Who doesn't sing favorite songs--loudly--in the shower, complete with all lyrics memorized? This C&C will explore the things we love--and hate (think 80s hair bands!)--about American popular music of the last half of the 20th Century to today. We'll consider topics such as various musical genres, the effects of different instruments and equipment, the video age (Did video really kill the radio star?), the mp3 era, and others. Join us to read about, discuss, research, write and speak about music.

Section 009 • *Donald Duck was a Nazi? Propaganda in U.S. History* • David Elder • MWF • 10:30-11:35

We've all been exposed to propaganda, but what exactly is it? This course will provide an introduction to different types of persuasion, focusing specifically on the use, history and ethics of propaganda. In order to understand what propaganda is (and what it isn't) we will be looking historically at what has been considered in- and outside the realm of “good” or “acceptable” persuasion. This historical perspective will, hopefully, allow us to distinguish between propaganda and rhetoric and how persuasion turns into willed manipulation of the masses. We will focus on U.S. propaganda from WWI to the 2012 Presidential election.

Section 010 • *Playing, Saying, Evading: Gender in Sports, Media, and Politics* • Jeremy Schnieder • MWF • 1:45-2:50

Is gender something that we as people shape or something that shapes us? The answer may not be as simple as it seems. By analyzing the ways our society plays, talks, and makes political decisions, this section of C&C will discuss some of the ways that gender affects our values.

Section 011 • *Immigration: Whose Land is It, Anyway?* • Joe Shufro • MWF • 1:45-2:50

*“This land is your land, this land is my land...” the opening line from a well-known song, raises the question posed in our course title, a question made highly significant by the raging controversy over immigration policy in our country today. In this class we will explore such issues as “Are immigrants taking my job?” “English only or *jinglés con español*?” “How should we deal with undocumented (“illegal”) immigrants?” and “Will building a wall on the border with Mexico make us safer? In our exploration process we will develop communication habits that will apply not only to immigration but also to the wide range of issues that affect our lives.*
